3. In today's context, what are some ways we can challenge and overcome cultural or societal barriers to spread the Gospel?

Read Acts 10:34 - 48

4. How does Peter's obedience to the Spirit's instruction demonstrate his faith and surrender to God's will?
5. What does the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the Gentiles imply about God's acceptance of all people?
6. What does Peter mean when he says, "God does not show favouritism but accepts from every nation the one who fears him and does what is right" (Acts 10:34-35)?
7. How do the reactions of the Jewish believers to the Holy Spirit falling on the Gentiles reflect on their understanding of God's plan?
8. In what ways does the baptism of the Gentiles symbolize the breaking of religious and cultural barriers?

9. How can Peter's willingness to learn, understand, and change be a model for us today when facing new perspectives?
10. How does Acts 10 challenge your current understanding of inclusivity and acceptance in the faith community?
11. How does the concept of equality in God's eyes challenge the way we perceive and interact with others?
