Introductory Questions

Read 1 Peter 2:4-10

- 1. Who is the 'living stone' mentioned in verse 4? What are some of the different responses to the living stone that we see?
- 2. In verse 5, what does Peter say believers are to be? What exactly is a spiritual sacrifice?
- What is the cornerstone mentioned in verse 6?
- 4. What will happen to those that believe in the cornerstone?
- What will happen to those who reject the cornerstone? (v. 7)
- 6. What does Peter mean when he writes that the cornerstone will cause some people to stumble? (v. 7)
- 7. What are the four major descriptions Peter uses for believers in verse 9? Elaborate a little bit on what each of these terms means.
- 8. Verse 10 says that once we had not received mercy, but now we have. How does your life before Christ compare to your life after salvation? What are the major changes the Lord has brought about in your life? What are some ways He is growing you right now?





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Covenant Relationships



One of the ideas of covenant relationships is that of responsibility and remembrance. For us as Christians, we have become God's responsibility – and we also become the responsibility of others – such as church community, home groups, ministry groups. It is important to acknowledge that responsibility and to remember what Christ has done for us – to make us more understanding and open to giving our lives for Jesus.
